Who God Is- The Trinity

Lesson #2

The Three that are One

The Trinity is the Title given for God the Father, God the Son- Jesus Christ, and God the Holy Spirit. A better description would be "the triune God". They are three separate distinct Persons who have one essence that have always existed as ONE TRUE GOD. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are not three Gods nor are they three names for the same person.
